INTRODUCTION

WHERE WE STARTED

When the pandemic hit NYC, we were devastated to see how small businesses were affected over a matter of weeks. Some businesses attempted to set up delivery services, others began selling make-your-own food packages, and some shut their doors entirely. It was quickly apparent that the government relief package was not going to be enough to support small businesses and that many of our friends and neighbors would lose their livelihoods.





We knew we needed to do something to help. We began collecting the Venmo and GoFundMe accounts of small businesses throughout Brooklyn and encouraged direct donations to help these businesses survive. We created an Instagram account, a website, and a Facebook page to strengthen community support. We also hung signs all across Brooklyn to draw attention to the businesses that really needed help. Within a few weeks, we had gathered a strong following on social media. Neighborhood Associations reached out to us to support their neighborhood establishments. We received significant feedback from local businesses that our publicity was working and was driving donations to their businesses.

OUR MISSION

Brooklyn Donates is a 501(c)(3) charitable organization in Brooklyn, New York, founded in March 2020, that prioritizes the socio-economic well being of New York City neighborhoods and small businesses. We provide relief to those facing economic hardship, particularly small businesses and their teams. We emphasize equity in all aspects of our operation, and are uniquely focused on the social and economic health of NYC communities. Our focus is on combating community deterioration and preventing the further gentrification of Brooklyn neighborhoods. It is our priority to provide assistance to individuals that may not otherwise have resources to maintain a small business during a crisis, and that contribute substantial social and cultural value to their local communities.



WHAT WE HAVE DONE

In April 2020, we decided to take the steps to officially incorporate as a non-profit organization, realizing this would allow us to have a greater impact on the businesses that needed the most help. After many sleepless nights shaping the organization, we were granted 501(c)(3) status, and were better able to mobilize.



We began a grassroots effort to collect donations and created a fund for small business relief. By June 2020, we raised over \$50,000 and were able to begin accepting grant applications from local businesses, and freelance artists and musicians.

We aim to serve our community by paying particular attention to small businesses owned by women, black, Indigenous and people of color (BIPOC), and members of the LGBTQ+ community. Our first grant recipient was Flatbush's Sip unWine, a small Caribbean restaurant known for its extensive community involvement. In addition to distributing grants, we also worked with small business owners to increase their community presence. We conducted a photoshoot for El Rinconcito Mix in Crown Heights, a new Latina-owned Mexican/Dominican restaurant, helping to put their amazing food on the map.



BY THE NUMBERS

Since our inception, we have focused on equity and access in our outreach efforts and grant programs. Race and language disparities in the accessibility and lending of PPP loans have exacerbated systemic issues, and COVID-19 closures have disproportionately affected minority- and women- owned businesses,



GRANTS AWARDED

We have distributed \$91,200 since we began fundraising. We have been able to give grants to 22 small business owners in Brooklyn and other boroughs. We have also built a supportive online presence for Brooklyn small businesses, in which we endeavor to raise awareness of ways we can all support local and shop small.



Through the power of community, we have awarded grants to small businesses in 14 NYC neighborhoods. In 2021, we hope to expand our reach into the rest of Brooklyn.





As soon as NYC gave the green light to extend the outdoor dining initiative, we knew that small businesses would be looking for ways to transform their spaces for the winter. We distributed 17 grants to help small businesses purchase heaters, plexiglass, and more. Grant recipients included bars, restaurants, cafes, yoga studios, and even a pre-school!

As we enter 2021, having distributed \$91,200 in grants to small businesses, we are excited and motivated to continue supporting NYC's beloved local establishments.
